



## Situation Update

### KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- ❖ **Five (5) new COVID-19 confirmed cases** have been reported in the last 24 hours bringing the cumulative total of **COVID-19 confirmed cases** in Uganda to **121**. No COVID-19 related death has been registered to date.
- ❖ A cumulative total of **54/121 (45%)** confirmed cases have recovered and been discharged.
- ❖ Ninety-one percent (110/121) are **imported cases**, 7% are **local transmissions** (8/121) while 2% have an **unknown chain of transmission** (3/121).
- ❖ A total of **1,839 laboratory samples** were tested today bringing it to a cumulative total of **58,994 samples** tested.
- ❖ A cumulative total of **3,908 contacts (1,452 still under follow up)** have been listed to date, **2,456 (63%)** of whom have completed the mandatory 14-day follow up period and been discharged from daily follow up.
- ❖ A total of **657 high-risk individuals** are under institutional quarantine in 31 districts in the country.

## 2. Public Health Actions

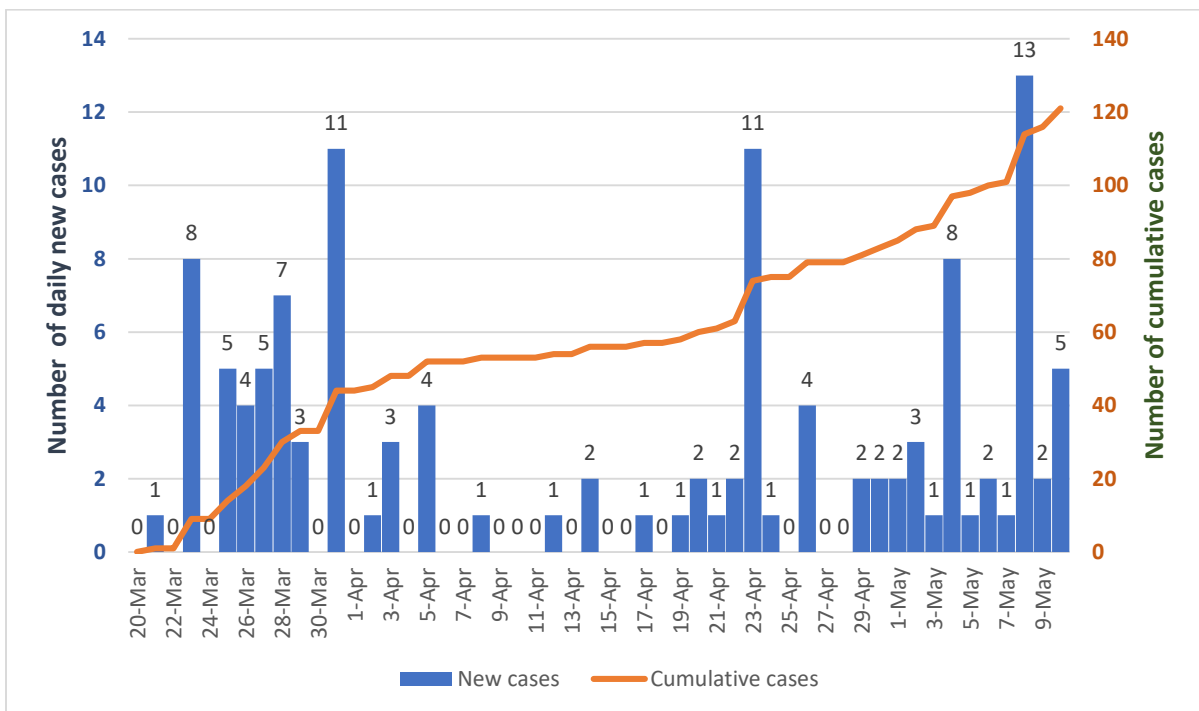
### COORDINATION

- The Incident Management Team meeting chaired by the Incident Commander continues to meet thrice daily.

### SURVEILLANCE

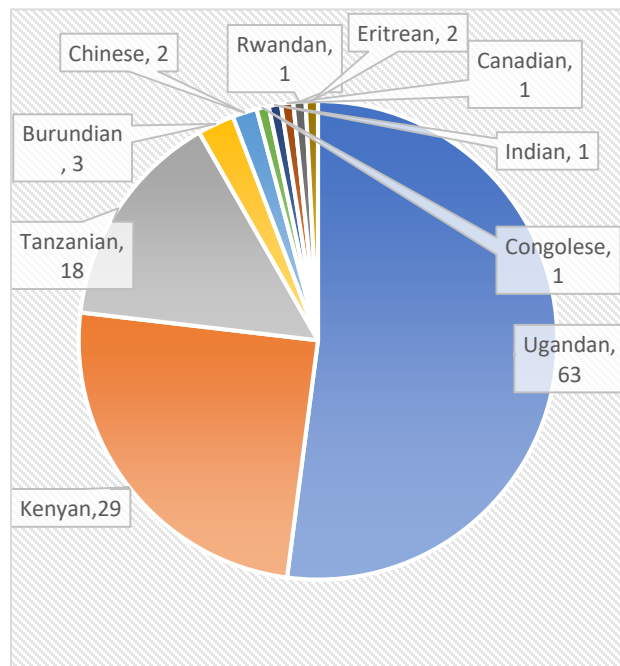
- A total of 121 confirmed cases have been line listed; of these, 110 are imported cases, 8 are locally transmitted while 3 have an unknown chain of transmission.
- The 5 new confirmed cases are Kenyan (3) and Ugandan (2) truck drivers who arrived from South Sudan (4) and Kenya (1) via Elegu and Malaba borders accordingly. Efforts to track them are underway.

New and cumulative cases of COVID-19 in Uganda

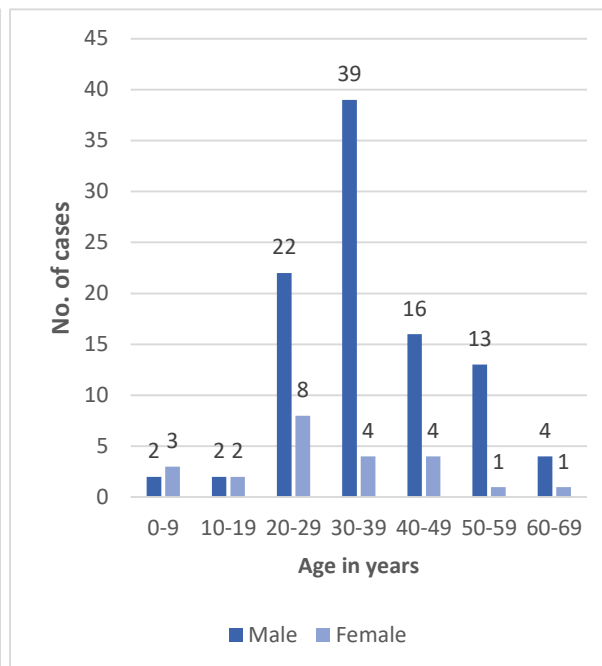




**Distribution of cases by nationality**

- Community film vans have been deployed to cover Rakai, Kyotera, Masindi and Mutukula districts.



- The team continues to release daily press briefs to update the general public on the COVID-19 outbreak.

## LOGISTICS

- The Ministry of Health received the following contributions:
  - A pickup truck from the Indian Business Forum.
  - PPE worth UGX 60M from UCC.
  - UGX 345,000,000 from American Tower Corporation.
  - Twenty-eight (28) cars procured by UNICEF with funding from GAVI.
  - UGX 3,200,000 from the Redeemed Christian Church of God.
  - Three (3) pickups, 1 tonne of posho, rice, soya and beans.
  - 7,000 COVID-19 antibody test kits from Entebbe Handling Services.
  - Medical supplies (200 face masks and 18 boxes of hand gloves) from the association of children of NRA/UPDF soldiers.
